Partake in a moveable feast of place-based experiences and engagements led by expert facilitators and instructors eager to share the power and beauty of this island.

Engage your senses

Have fun with your peers playing in the ocean, on a Ropes Course, kayaking, snorkeling, hiking, star-gazing, campfires, and more in this beautiful learning environment.

Learn collaboratively while exploring local/global climate change issues and impacts, resiliency and sustainability with a focus on local food and energy systems. Engage with next-generation food and energy producers. Explore human and nature-centered design while helping restore watersheds and ancient sustainable fishponds.



Develop systems-thinking skills

Explore Native Hawaiian systemsthinking approaches expressed through cultural and conservation practices, food and energy systems, and sustainable tourism. Reflect and engage with others to help develop your own place-appropriate strategies.

Eligibility: Applicants must have:

- Basic communication skills in English
- Interest in responding positively to the challenges of climate changes in order to build a more just, peaceful and sustainable world
- Willingness to take part in outdoor activities and have reasonable fitness

Course Fee: \$3,000 includes:

- All food, lodging, admissions/fees and ground transportation (including to and from Honolulu International Airport)
- All equipment, outdoor activities, instruction by qualified professionals
- All educational material and instruction
- Does NOT include:
 - Air travel costs to and from Honolulu International Airport
 - Visa costs (as required)
 - Individual health insurance (all participants are required to show proof of individual health insurance)

Age requirement: 15 to 18 years as of August 3, 2020

Scholarship Availability: Limited scholarship funds available based on demonstrated need
